Mayor Jackie Warner called the regular meeting of the Hope Mills Board of Commissioners to order on Monday, June 18, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The invocation was led by Pastor Michael Mathis, Mission Field Ministries, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Jackie Warner.

2. PRESENTATIONS:

Town Manager Melissa P. Adams introduced the new Town Clerk Jane Starling and discussed her previous work experience and certification.

NCLA Student Library Ambassador, Alizdair Sebastien Ray read the last paragraph of his essay and spoke to the Board about the importance of libraries and explained that this

Town Manager Adams remarked this item is for projects that were previously approved but the amendments were not done at the time.

Finance Director Drew Holland submitted the following three Budget Amendments. The first is for FEMA road repairs approved at the January 22, 2018 meeting for \$149,149 and was never submitted for approval. The contact amount of \$149,149 is to be reimbursed by FEMA. Budget Amendment #35 for \$149,150 is recommended for approval. The second Budget Amendment is to allocate Powell Bill funds from the prior year for the paving contract and was never submitted for approval. The Town combined two years of Powell Bill funding for road resurfacing in order to have a larger project size for better bid results. \$100,000 is needed from the prior year for the paving contract. Budget Amendment #36 for \$100,000 is recommended for approval. The third Budget Amendment is for the Adcock Street Storm Water project approved on September 11, 2017 for \$125,367.23 it was never submitted for approval. The project has been completed and paid. Budget Amendment #37 for \$125,375 is recommended for approval.

Motion made by Commissioner Bellflowers, seconded by Commissioner Edwards and carried unanimously, to approve Budget Amendment #38 for \$107,325 and #39 operating transfer from the General Fund for \$105,700.

7. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. Discussion and update on Hope Mills Lake Park Phase II Project (Fleming and Associates, P.A.) status.

Town Manager Adams commented Stephen Fleming of Fleming and Associates completed the Geotech survey and are working on design options for the lake park which include the option of a bulkhead. The house on the Saleeby property needs to be evaluated for mold remediation, scheduled for demolition and repurpose of building materials for possible uses by the Historic Preservation Commission. The lot will then be cleared and graded with temporary crush and run placed for use as additional parking for the lake park.

Motion made by Mayor Pro Tem Mitchell, seconded by Commissioner Bellflowers and carried unanimously, to instruct staff to move forward with obtaining cost proposals for the demolition and completion of an additional parking lot on the Saleeby property.

- b. Consideration of proposal from Donald M. Thomas for geese control at the Hope Mills Lake. Estimated cost for first two weeks two to three thousand dollars.

Town Manager Adams commented she has researched options for geese control. Some methods she discovered are; air guns, flags, pinwheels, and numerous other methods to deter geese activity. Based on my discussion with other municipalities the only method that appears to work is control by Border Collies. Mr. Thomas indicated that this is not the optimal time to begin the program as the geese have young which are unable to fly. The parents will not fly away and leave the young. Town Manager Adams recommend the Board take no action revisit the issue later if the Board so chooses.”

Mayor Warner inquired if the goose waste can be cleaned up prior to the Lake Celebration event. Town Manager Adams responded we need to encourage people to stop feeding the geese. Animal Control Officer Paul Howard provided information which suggested temporary fencing along the shoreline to prevent the geese from coming ashore. The next step would be determining an amount and fining citizens as permitted by our ordinance.

Commissioner Bellflowers stated the activity level of the public will eventually move the geese along.

No action was taken.

8. REPORTS AND INFORMATION ITEMS:

a. Manager's report

Town Manager Adams provided the following report:

1. Rockfish Road sidewalk – Crews are installing a temporary silt erosion control fence along the portion of Rockfish Road where we will be installing the sidewalk. Public Works Director Hector Cruz has a meeting with the DOT District Engineer tomorrow on Tuesday, June 19th. We are hopeful that construction on the sidewalk project will begin soon.
2. Damaged areas from Hurricane Matthew - River Road – Diversion of the water line has been completed. PWC conducted initial water sampling and was required to do a secondary sampling due to the first not meeting the threshold for bacteria.
3. Eel migratory season (3/15 – 6/15) ended on June 15th. The total count for the reporting period is 229. A final report has been sent to the appropriate agencies. The next reporting dates are from September 1st through October 15th.
4. The McAdams Group was here on Tuesday, June 12th as part of their public input session. Since then I have sent them the contact information for the area Churches, and various civic organizations so that they may send them survey packets for area distribution. Staff will be conducting the public survey at the next Food Truck Rodeo scheduled for Thursday, July 5th. The McAdams Group will come on another date and time when they can conduct that survey. Information will be provided to the public to let them know that staff will be conducting the July 5th survey.
5. The Historic Preservation Commission met on Wednesday, June 13th. Deputy Public Works Director Don Sisko presented his initial Scope of Work Statement for the Museum Project. In addition, they discussed the possibility of the demolition of the Episcopal Parrish House and the property that was donated to the Town on Fountain Lane and repurposing some of the lumber from the two buildings for new construction of a small structure to replace the Parrish House.
6. Town Manager Adams has been asked by the NC League of Municipalities Board of Directors Nominating Committee if she would be interested in serving on the Board of Directors as an alternate for one of the three Managers positions on the Board. If appointed, she would serve as an alternate until 2020, and at that time she would become eligible to serve as a member on the Board of Directors for two – two year terms.
7. The Police Department conducted a speed survey from 5/31/2018 through 6/11/2018 in regards to a citizen complaint of speeding on Pinewood Drive. The complaint also addressed vehicles crossing the center line and driving in the opposite lane. The survey consisted of data obtained through our radar speed display sign, directed patrols, and a door to door neighborhood inquiry.

The following is a synopsis of the findings:

Total Vehicles: **3054** Violator Vehicles: **54**

Avg Speed: **22 mph** Max Speed: **42 mph**

Avg Violator Speed: **35 mph**

A door to door inquiry of residents on Pinewood Drive was conducted and **12 of 13** houses requested speed bumps. Based on the findings, it is recommended that speed calming devices be placed at 2 locations on Pinewood Drive.

The consensus of the Board was for the police department to move forward with the calming devices.

- Discussion and update on the proposed joint Public Safety (Police and Fire) Facility status.

Finance Director Holland commented since the last meeting with Garner & Brown Architects on May 14, 2018, we are still in the preliminary programming stage of the project. The location of the building on the current sites and construction staging was discussed as the site will be very tight during the process. Staff is looking into using areas around the construction site for temporary staging and storing of construction materials. The current budget has \$70,000 for items relating to the project and \$6,500 has been spent for the site survey. The Capital Improvement Plan has the estimated project total listed at \$8,000,000.

- Update on Hope Mills Lake Water Quality testing.

Town Manager Adams informed the Board that staff was unable to perform sampling last week due to the rain. We do not sample within 48 hours of a rain event due to the influx of bacteria due to stormwater runoff. Staff will maintain sampling results by performing two sample collections during this week of June 18, 2018. Samples will be averaged and the totals from each sampling event over the thirty day period should not exceed the State allowable limits. We are hopeful that the Town can re-open the swimming area safely for the lake celebration and the July fourth planned events. Water sampling took place today and staff will take another sample on Wednesday June 20, 2018.

MOSQUITO SPRAYING AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") made this 2nd day of July, 2018, by and between TOWN OF HOPE MILLS, a North Carolina municipal corporation ("Hope Mills"), and the Town of Spring Lake, A North Carolina municipal corporation ("Spring Lake");

WHEREAS, Hope Mills operates a mosquito spraying program, and, at the request of Spring Lake, Hope Mills has offered to provide these services to Spring Lake;

WHEREAS, N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160-A-461 authorizes North Carolina municipalities to enter into undertakings with each other'

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Hope Mills shall spray for mosquitoes once within the jurisdiction of Spring Lake on the months of July, August and September of 2018. The area to be sprayed shall be jointly determined by the staff of the two towns.
2. Within thirty (30) days of each scheduled mosquito spray, Spring Lake shall reimburse Hope Mills Four Hundred Forty-five and 35/100 Dollars (\$445.35), which reflects the approximate cost of labor and materials for the spraying.
3. Spring Lake shall hold harmless and indemnify Hope Mills, its agents, employees and officials, against any and all claims made by Spring Lake's agents, employees or officials and/or by third parties against Hope Mills, its agents, employees or officials, for any and all claims arising from or in any way connected to the mosquito spraying authorized by this Agreement, except for claims based on negligence of any agent or employee of Hope Mills. This hold harmless and indemnification provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
4. Hope Mills and Spring Lake agree to not unlawfully discriminate by reason of age, race, religion, color, sex, national origin or disability while performing this Agreement.

At the April 16, 2018 Regular Board of Commissioners Meeting the Board voted to place the amendment to the Hope Mills Town Charter to alter the terms served by Board Members, including the Mayor to four-year staggered terms on the 2018 election ballot. On June 18, 2018 a Public Hearing was held to receive comments on amending The Town of Hope Mills Town Charter to alter the terms served by the Board members to four-year staggered terms, as permitted by N.C. Gen. Stat. 160A-101(4) and N.C. Gen. Stat. 160A-101(8) and to be placed on the November 6, 2018 election ballot.

Following the Public Hearing the Board of Commissioners voted to have Town Attorney Dan Hartzog draft an Ordinance to amend the Town Charter to change the terms of office for the Mayor and Board of Commissioners to staggered four year terms. The Board must also adopt a Resolution calling for a Referendum for the purpose of submitting to a vote the Ordinance implementing four year staggered terms for the Mayor and Board of Commissioners.

Attached for your consideration are Ordinance No. 2018-02 and Resolution No. 2018-14.

Ordinance No. 2018-02

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWN CHARTER TO CHANGE THE TERMS OF
OFFICE FOR THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO STAGGERED FOUR
YEAR TERMS**

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Hope Mills desires to amend the Town of Hope Mills Town Charter resolves to consider amending the Town of Hope Mills Town Charter to alter the terms served by Board members to four-year staggered terms, as permitted by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-101(4);

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have complied with all provisions of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-102 by adopting a resolution of intent on May 7, 2018, publishing a notice of public hearing on June 7, 2018 and holding a public hearing on June 18, 2018;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners desires to have the citizens of Hope Mills determine whether the Mayor and Board of Commissioners serve staggered four year terms;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that, subject to approval by a vote in the next general election, Article III of the Town's Charter, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-102, to read as follows:

Article III - Elections

Sec. 3.1 – Regular Municipal Elections

Regular municipal elections shall be held in each odd numbered year, and shall be conducted in accordance with the uniform municipal election laws of North Carolina.

Sec. 3.2 – Conduct and Method of Elections

The Mayor and members of the Town Board shall be elected according to the nonpartisan plurality method of elections.

Sec. 3.2 – Election of the Mayor

A Mayor shall be elected every four years.

Sec. 3.3 – Election of the Town Board

At the regular municipal election in 2019, there shall be elected five members of the Town Board to fill the seats of those officers whose terms are then expiring. The two members who receive

the highest number of votes shall serve a four year term, while the remaining three members elected shall serve a two year term. Thereafter, in the 2021 election, there shall be elected three members of the Town Board to fill the seats of those officers whose terms are then expiring. The three commissioners elected in the 2021 election shall serve four year terms. In each election after 2021, Board members shall be elected to fill the seats of those officers whose terms are then expiring, and shall serve four year terms in staggered biennial elections.

Sec. 3.4 – This ordinance shall take effect only upon approval by majority vote of the vote of the citizens of Hope Mills, as provided in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-102.

RESOLUTION NO 2018-14

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE TOWN OF HOPE MILLS CALLING FOR A REFERENDUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO A VOTE AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING FOUR YEAR STAGGERED TERMS FOR THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-101 and 160A-102, the Town Board for the Town of Hope Mills enacted an ordinance on July 9, 2018, amending the Town of Hope Mills Town Charter to implement staggered four year terms for the Mayor and Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-102, the ordinance provides that it will become effective only if approved by a vote of the people.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Hope Mills Board of Commissioners that:

1. A general election will be held on November 6, 2018 and will include a vote of the people for the purpose of determining whether the Town's Charter shall be amended to provide for four year staggered terms for the Mayor and Board of Commissioners.

2. Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 163A-1592, the Cumberland County Board of Elections is hereby requested to conduct the election herein described and the Town Clerk is directed to forthwith deliver a copy of this resolution to said Board of Elections.

3. Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-102, the Town Clerk shall cause to be duly published in accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. § 163A-1592, a notice of the election hereby called.

4. The election shall be held in accordance with Article 23, Chapter 163A of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

SUBJECT: Lake Sampling and Notification Policy update

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Town Staff coordinated with State Division of Water Resources and staff from Wake County to determine a standard for Town sampling that would allow us to establish a baseline for water quality back in May 2018. Staff has coordinated with the State and through research to determine minimum measures that would be effective in monitoring the lake for the interest of public health and safety.

Although the Town is under no delegated authority to monitor, it is the right thing to do because of known contaminants in surface waters. The policy presented is a draft copy for review by the Board of Commissioners, Town Attorney and the State Standards and Standard Table staff liaison. Staff was encouraged to use the Wake County guidance, so the Town Draft policy is very similar to Wake County.

Differences in the Town policy are due to the fact that Wake County's policy is being regulated through the County Health Department under jurisdiction of the State Delegation to their County. Staff incorporated a sampling policy and notification policy/procedures as part of the draft.

Manager's Update

Staff contacted State Division of Water Resources and spoke with Ms. Connie Brower about water standards and standards tables. Ms. Brower informed staff that the Town is under no obligation to sample and Federal guidance delegate's authority to the State and then they determine sample sites. She informed that we are welcome to use the State standards and she was happy to review any policy we wish to implement, but we are not required to or delegated authority.

Staff reviewed the sampling methods and sample readings. For the month of June 2018, 15 out of 16 samples did not exceed State limits. Ms. Brower indicated that the Town had gone above any requirement. She informed Staff that all Class B waters are "swim at your own risk". Town Staff discussed methods with the Town Manager and everyone agreed that in the interest of public safety that we would continue to sample during swimming season and adopt a policy that outlined these procedures including public notifications.

Town of Hope Mills

Regulations Governing Sampling and Public Notification of Hope Mills Lake

WHEREAS, the Town of Hope Mills after study and investigation of the facts pertaining thereto, finds that there is a clear and present need to protect and enhance the public health by notifying the public when bacteria levels in public recreational waters and beaches present a potential health risk to those engaged in water activities, as herein defined,

NOW, therefore, be it ordained by the Town of Hope Mills Board of Commissioners that the following Regulations be, and hereby are, adopted pursuant to said Board.

SECTION I. SCOPE AND PURPOSE

The purpose of these Regulations is to establish water quality monitoring criteria and standards designed to protect the public from harmful levels of pathogens associated with fecal contamination while participating in water contact activities at public recreational waters and establish an advisory notification policy.

SECTION II. JURISDICTION

- A. These Regulations shall apply throughout the territorial jurisdiction of the Town of Hope Mills, North Carolina.
- B. The Town of Hope Mills Manager or their designee is responsible for the administration and enforcement of these Regulations, including but not limited to: water quality monitoring, notifications to the public about monitoring results which require action, and public education related to improving water quality.

SECTION III. DEFINITIONS

- (A) **Advisory** - Public notification based on established water quality criteria indicating the potential for a public health risk.
- (B) **Lake** – Hope Mills Lake
- (C) **Board** - The Town of Hope Mills Board of Commissioners

- (D) **Manager** – The Town of Hope Mills Town Manager or their designees.
- (E) **Person** - means and includes an individual, firm, corporation, association, partnership, or company.
- (F) **Primary Contact** - means an activity in which a person's head may be partially or completely submerged.
- (G) **Public Health Nuisance** - a condition of or use of property that could or does cause or result in personal injury or disease to members of the public as defined in North Carolina General Statutes 130A 19.
- (H) **Public Recreational Waters** - natural lakes, man-made lakes and similar public water contact recreational places not classified as public swimming pools.
- (I) **Restriction** - lake closure.

SECTION IV. WATER QUALITY MONITORING

- A. **WATER QUALITY SAMPLES** – Town of Hope Mills shall monitor water quality at public recreational waters by taking grab samples for the recommended indicator bacteria in accordance with the North Carolina Division of Water Resources adopted/current Surface Water Quality standards for Class B Waters.
1. Samples will be obtained (1) once monthly from April – September for Fecal Coliform Bacteria and once annually for E.coli and Enterococci to establish baseline standards for Hope Mills Lake.
- B. **BACTERIOLOGICAL WATER QUALITY STANDARDS** - Natural and man-made lakes, water courses, and other recreational water facilities not defined as a public swimming pool in North Carolina General Statues 130A-280 shall be subject to the either of the following bacteriological water quality indicator standards:
1. Fecal Coliform Bacteria: No single sample shall exceed the North Carolina Division of Water Resources current standards. If exceedance occurs, a minimum of five samples will be collected during a (30) thirty day period until samples remain below standards.
 2. E.coli: testing will be done to create a baseline of water quality for this indicator.
 3. Enterococci: testing will be done to create a baseline of water quality for this indicator.

SECTION V. LAKE NOTIFICATION AND RESTRICTIONS

- A. Upon exceedance of fecal coliform bacteria of the concentration thresholds per North Carolina Division of Water Resources current standards, the Town of Hope Mills shall notify the public of potential public health risks associated with high levels of indicator bacteria using.
- B. Upon notice by the Town of Hope Mills of an exceedance of a bacteriological standard, notification and closure procedures as prescribed in Section VI. Signs. The Manager or their designee shall issue a Public Notice.
- C. The Manager or their Designee may order the lake closed, or restricted, based on knowledge of a sewer spill or other conditions that have the potential to become a public health nuisance or hazard. The Manager or their designee shall issue a Public Notice to close the lake.
- D. The Manger or their designee will conduct follow-up sampling of the lake under advisory and/or restriction. The lake shall remain under advisory and/or restriction until subsequent water sampling indicates compliance with the bacteriological standards in Section IV. Bacteriological Water Quality Standards. The Manager or his designee shall notify public when an advisory or restriction is rescinded.

SECTION VI. SIGNS AND PUBLIC ADVISORY

Signage for public advisories and restrictions shall be posted in accordance with the Town of Hope Mills Advisory Notification process.

- A. Advisory Notification Process will require the Town of Hope Mills to publicly post advisories to communicate health risks associated with primary contact water activities. Notifications will be associated with (3) colors: Green, Yellow, and Red.
 - a. Green – No advisory; bacteria is below exceedance thresholds.
 - b. Yellow – Caution; recent tests results indicate elevated levels of bacteria; enter water at your own risk. Advisory will remain in place until bacteria levels no longer exceed the standard. During heavy rain events, yellow advisory will be issued due to increased pollutants.
 - c. Red – Closed for public health nuisance; conditions exist for elevated health risks. Body contact with water is not allowed. Lake will remain closed until the nuisance is abated.

SECTION VII. RIGHT OF ENTRY

Subject to the provisions of North Carolina General Statutes 130A-17, the Manager or their Designee shall have the right of entry upon any premises where entry is necessary to investigate, sample and to enforce any remedy allowed hereunder.

SECTION VIII. VIOLATIONS

Failure to comply with the requirements of the advisory, including but not limited to notification, signage, restrictions or closures, shall constitute a violation of these Regulations.

SECTION IX. PENALTIES

Any person who violates any of these Regulations or shall fail to perform any act required by these Regulations shall be given a warning of the violation. Further non-compliance with regulations will subject person to be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to punishment as provided in North Carolina General Statutes 130A 25 as well as civil remedies set forth in Part 2, Article 1 of General Statutes Chapter 30A.

SECTION X. APPEAL PROCEDURES

Appeals of penalties under these Regulations concerning the interpretation and enforcement of these Regulations shall be conducted in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes BOA 24 (b) through (d). Appeals must be made in writing within (30) thirty days of penalty to the Town of Hope Mills Board of Adjustment.

SECTION XI. ABROGATION

Nothing in these Regulations shall restrict or abrogate the authority of the Town of Hope Mills Board of Commissioners or Town Manager from exercising any authority under applicable state law with respect to public recreational waters and lakes, as defined in these Regulations.

SECTION XI. EFFECTIVE DATE

These Regulations Governing Sampling of Hope Mills Lake and Public Notification shall be in full force and effect from and after _____. These Regulations were adopted on _____.
